Lodge News---Syttende Mai

Syttende Mai was our most recent celebration with our lodge members. Among Norwegians, the day is referred to simply as "Syttende Mai" (17th of May) or Grunnlovsdagen (The Constitution Day). The Constitution, declaring Norway an independent nation, was signed at Eidsvoll, Norway on May 17, 1814.

At that time, Norway was under Swedish rule, and for many years the King of Sweden was reluctant to allow such celebrations. For a few years in the 1820s, King Carl Johan forbade the celebrations. It was not until 1836 that anyone ventured to hold a public address on behalf of the day. That year, official celebration was initiated near the monument of the late politician Christian Krogh, known to have stopped the king from gaining too much personal power. In 1905, Norway separated from Sweden peacefully and became a truly independent country. By historical coincidence, World War II ended when the occupying German forces surrendered in Norway on May 8, 1945, just nine days before that year's Constitution Day. Even if the Liberation Day is an official flag day in Norway, the day is not broadly celebrated. Instead, a new and broader meaning had been added to the celebration of Norwegian Constitution Day on May 17. https://www.17thofmay.org/

At our Syttende Mai celebration, members present voted to name our lodge Viking Ship parade float "Selma" after a legendary sea serpent said to live in Lake Seljord (Seljordsvatnet) in Seljord, Telemark, Norway. The coat of arms, designed by sculptor, Trygve Magnus Barstad, is pictured here. There have been witness accounts, dating back to 1750, especially on hot, quiet summers.

2024 Convention Report

Sons of Norway, District 2 2024 Convention, hosted by Harald Haarfager Lodge and Tordenskjold Lodge, in Coeur d'Alene Idaho Convened May 29-June 1, 2024 at the Best Western Coeur d'Alene Inn. Three Delegates, Dave McManus, Karen Williams, and Suzanne Knutson, as well as Zone 5 Director, Cindy McManus, and guest, Matthew Barrie attended, representing Harald Haarfager Lodge. Wednesday evening included dinner and a Bunad Parade, and entertainment by local duo, Courtney & Company, with David Powell playing Harp Guitar. Many attendees had never seen or heard this instrument before. Meetings consisted of an introduction to the new Sons of Norway CEO Daniel Seyfried, presentation (by Jerry Hanson) on the Bukkahorn, as well as presentations on Ski for Light, Trollhaugen, insurance products, Foundation Scholarships, and Youth Camps. Delegates voted on resolutions and new officers for the Trollhaugen Board, Ski For Light, District Officers, and Zone Directors. Delegates enjoyed several visits by Lena, Ole's wife, who had some great stories to share. Delegates and guests enjoyed a Viking Cruise on Lake Coeur d'Alene, Alaska Hospitality Night with accordion entertainment and sing-a-long, and a beautiful Memorial Service. On Saturday, new officers were installed and delegates enjoyed the afternoon off, to explore the area. The Saturday night banquet was fun and Matthew Barrie and Colleen Sisk did an amazing job distributing gift baskets to the raffle winners. Many friendships were renewed and new connections were made. Poulsbo Lodge will host the 2026 Convention and Harald Haarfager will be electing at least three delegates to attend. Who wants to go?

We sang several songs during the convention, including one called Nidelven. There are several versions of this song on YouTube if you care to listen. Here is the story behind the song "Nidelven", written by Oskar Haddø. He was in love with a young lady in Trondheim. She didn't think Oskar was sincere about their relationship so she broke it off. He was heartbroken. One day as he walked along the bank of the River Nid, he stopped at a bridge ("den gamle bybro" – the old city bridge) and there, composed this famous song, "Nidelven", which means the Nid River. When his beloved heard him sing the song, she knew that he was indeed sincere and agreed to accept his proposal of marriage. Oskar Haddø was part of a group of five Norwegian underground resistance fighters called the mil org. They were captured and executed by the German Gestapo in November of 1943. At the time, Oskar's wife was expecting their first child. Not far from Nidaros Domkirke (cathedral), a monument of a mother holding a child in her arms was erected in their memory. The monument was built following the war, in memory of Haddø and many other resistance fighters, all of whom are buried in the same grave in the cathedral cemetery.

For this convention we tried a free drawing for an item on each of the three days of the convention on order to get folks to visit the room. This was a smashing success as we had 85 to 95 visitors each day! We offered a chip-carved ornament, a Viking Knot bracelet, and a rosemaled mini-tote as the drawing items. Folks seemed excited to see these and the chance to take home a "little extra something" from the convention.

While we would have loved to have seen more items entered, I think those that were represented our Norwegian cultural skills well. I look forward to seeing what the next convention will present for their Cultural Room. I certainly appreciated the time and experience I had while helping in the room, and enjoying the parts of the convention I was able to see. We had a great team that got along well, and I think that added to the cultural room experience overall.

Membership Dues Increase: Effective July 1, 2024

In November 2023, a SON International Board committee was assigned to evaluate dues as they continue to look at the overall budget. Member dues have not increased since 2018, while inflation has increased 21%. After numerous meetings and data evaluation, the International Board of Directors has recommended a dues in-crease to be effective 1 July 2024.

Individual Membership - \$24 per year increase to \$84 Family Membership - \$48 per year increase to \$143

Annually, the district and local lodge will each receive a \$1 increase for an individual membership, and a \$2 increase for a family membership. The remaining increase will go to International for administrative and operating costs. This was not voted on at the Convention, but it was discussed at length. Many delegates felt that member opinions should have been heard before a decision was made. Many lodges are concerned that their membership will decrease.

Did you know...

There are 38 Lodges in District Two from Alaska, Oregon, Idaho, and Washington. One website says there are 47 lodges. Zone 5 includes Coeur d'Alene & Boise, Idaho, Spokane, Yakima, Moses Lake, Kennewick, East Wenatchee, and Clarkson, Washington. Zone 5 has eight lodges (as does Zone 4) but Zone 5 is spread out over the most miles and has the least number of members. Leif Erickson Lodge in Seattle has 1419 members and is the largest lodge in the district, (but has no president) and Columbia Basin Lodge (Moses Lake) is the smallest lodge with 21 members. Harald Haarfager has 120 members.


