



After our delicious meal, we learned about the Sons of Norway Cultural Skills Program and Sports Program and then had a Norwegian Language Lesson with our new Lodge Instructor, Matthew Barrie. Matthew earned a minor in Norwegian in college and will be helping those who choose to participate to work through the Sons of Norway lessons presented on www.sofn.com. Our first lesson covered the alphabet, numbers to ten, greetings, and simple phrases. We also learned the traditional Norwegian Birthday Song, which is quite different than the American song. ## Norwegian Recipe—Aquavit Spritzer

### INGREDIENTS

1 tablespoon raw sugar

¾ cup berry preserves, preferably lingonberry

4 cups of soda water (32 ounces)

4 cups of Aquavit

8 wedges of fresh lemon

### FINISHING INGREDIENTS

Fresh mint or thyme

### INSTRUCTIONS

### Step 1

Combine sugar and 1 Tbsp. hot water in a pitcher. Stir to dissolve. Add preserves. Using a wooden spoon, stir to loosen preserves and mix with simple syrup. Gently stir in soda water and aquavit.

### Step 2

Fill tumblers with ice. Divide aquavit spritzer equally among glasses and garnish each with a lemon twist.



## Norwegian History Lesson





Harald "Bluetooth" Gormsson (Old Norse: Haraldr Blátonn Gormsson) died c. 986) was a king of Denmark and Norway.

He was the son of King Gorm the Old and of Thyra Dannebod. Bluetooth ruled as the king of Denmark from c. 958 – c. 986. Harald introduced Christianity to Denmark and consolidated his rule over most of Jutland and Zealand. Harald's rule as king of Norway began following the assassination of King Harald Greycloak of Norway and was more tenuous, most likely lasting for no more than a few years in the 970s. Some sources say his son Sweyn Forkbeard forcibly deposed him from his Danish throne before his death.

The Norse sagas present Harald in a rather negative light. He was forced twice to submit to the renegade prince Styrbjörn the Strong of the Jomsvikings. When Styrbjörn brought this fleet to Uppsala to claim the throne of Sweden, Harald broke his oath and fled with his Danes to avoid facing the Swedish army at the Battle of Fýrisvellir.

The Bluetooth wireless design we see on electronic devices was named after the king in 1997 and was based on an analogy that the technology would unite devices the way Harald Bluetooth united the tribes of Denmark into a single kingdom. The Bluetooth logo consists of a Younger Futhark bind rune for his initials, H and B.

## Syttende Mai Celebration—May 17, 2023

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at he Harald Haarfager Lodge (Trinity Lutheran Church, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho), we will be celebrating the 209th Anniversary of the signing of the Norwegian Constitution. We will hold a flag raising ceremony, and a proclamation from Mayor Hammond of Coeur d'Alene will be read.



After the service, we will form a people's parade

(folketog) around the neighborhood and circle back to the church for hot dogs, chips, ice cream, and soda - the customary delicacies of 17. Mai in Norway. Constitution Day(Grunnlovsdag) is the National Day of Norway celebrated every year on the 17th of May. It is simply

referred to as "Syttende Mai" (17th May) and is a colorful celebration of Norway's independence.

The constitution of Norway was signed on the 17th of May in 1814, declaring Norway an independent kingdom in an attempt to avoid control being given to Sweden after Denmark and Norway's defeat in the Napoleonic Wars. Celebrations of this day began early on but for years Sweden and Norway were reluctant to allow the celebrations as Norway was in a union with Sweden at the time. For a few years in the 1820s celebrations were banned, as King Charles XIV John, known in modern times as Karl III Johan, believed that celebrations were a protest against the union.

Celebrations were allowed to resume in 1829, after the Battle of the Square, in which a conflict took place between Norwegian demonstrators and the forces of the United Kingdoms of Sweden and Norway. King Charles XIV John agreed to lift the prohibition on constitutional celebrations on the 17th of May. In 1833 public addresses began to be held and in 1864 the day became even more established and representative of how it's celebrated today, when the first children's parade was launched in Christiania (Oslo). Originally only boys were allowed to participate in the children's parade, but in 1899, girls were allowed to join in on the parade as well. In 1905, the union with Sweden was dissolved and Prince Carl of Denmark was chosen to be King of a newly independent Norway under the name of Haakon VII.

The Coeur d'Alene lodge of Sons of Norway is the Harald Haarfager (or Harald Fairhair c. 850 – c. 932) lodge, in honor of the first Norwegian king. He reigned c. 872 to 930. Some historians argue that he did not exist as an historical figure, yet Harald has become a national icon of Norway and a symbol of independence. Though the king's sagas and medieval accounts have been critically scrutinized during the twentieth and early twenty-first centuries, Harald maintains his reputation as the father of the Norwegian nation. Gratulerer Norge med jubileet! (Congratulations Norway on your anniversary!) We hope you will plan to join the festivities!

## Possible Annual Event—Backpacking/Fish Trip with Art Collins

Lodge member Art Collins is suggesting an annual backpack/fishing trip event to an Alpine Lake location in the PNW (North Idaho, NE Washington, NW Montana, or British Columbia). The trip would occur in late August or early September as Art says, "the bugs are at a minimum due to the early morning frosts."

The event could be either a one day event with a short drive, hike, and fishing excursion, or a two-three day event requiring overnight camping at alpine lake locations. Backpacking /walking distances would be relatively short (1-5 miles) but there would be no electricity or modern conveniences like bathrooms or showers at these locations.

The group would decide ahead of time where the event would take place and what the rules of the trip and minimum equipment requirements would be. Meal menus would be planned in advance to include firepit cooking of combined resources but campers would be required to bring their own snacks and drinking water.

Fishing and camping equipment would be the responsibility of each group member and Art would share his fly fishing and camping experience with those that would like to go.


## Sons of Norway Book Club







